 THE ISSUANCE OF \$9,840,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS FOR CONSTRUCTION, ACQUISITION AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT (INCLUDING THE REHABILITATION, RENOVATION, **EXPANSION AND IMPROVEMENT THEREOF)** INCLUDING ELEMENTARY/INTERMEDIATE CAMPUS REMODELING, PAVING AND NEW CONSTRUCTION, JUNIOR HIGH/HIGH SCHOOL CAMPUS REMODELING, PAVING AND NEW CONSTRUCTION; ROOF REPAIR AT THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CENTER AND THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF





Elementary And Intermediate Campus

Elementary and Intermediate Campus

Security / monitoring:

Add enclosed or secure circulation between buildings.

Add a system to increase the campus safety and security.

Allow faculty to monitor the interior of the campus buildings as well.

Roof Leak repairs:

Repair roofing to eliminate further damage to ceiling, floors, walls and equipment.

Air Conditioning issues:

Replace aging units
Rework Ductwork and controls to increase efficiency.
Include more efficient controls.

Intercom / Call system Replacement

Add a full campus system to increase communication and monitoring.

Eliminating Portable buildings:

Add classrooms with restroom facilities.

Classroom upgrades:

Classroom space upgrades.

Upgrade to marker boards and tack boards.

Add ceiling-mounted projectors for media presentation

Replace flooring where needed.

Parking spaces:


Add parking near gym.





Science Facilities:


Add a Classroom / Science Lab wing.

Leaks:


Address ground water infiltration problems at the Drama room and Athletic Fields. Repair roofing leaks throughout the building.



 - Facility for regional and state youth tournaments














Proposition 3

\$990,000.00

- •Construction of an OISD track and Field Facility
- •8 lane 400 meter UIL approved running track
- Facilities for UIL approved
 - •Pole vault practice/competition runway and pit
 - •Long jump practice/competition runway and pit
 - •Triple jump practice/competition runway and pit
 - •High jump practice/competition runway and pit
 - Shot put practice/competition ring
 - •Discus practice/competition ring
- Spectator Seating
- •Secure lighted track for patrons/students/staff and community to access for after hours walking, jogging, running.

If all propositions pass the local property tax rate will increase 27.63 cents in 2015

If property values increase the tax rate will be reduced accordingly


Formula: (Assessed Valuation/100) X tax rate .2763

Taxpayers who are 65 and older will be exempt from this tax increase under Homestead Exemption.



PROJECT BREAKDOWN




Taxes by Local School Districts
