How Did We Get Here?

Texas, and the Nation, are experiencing a major teacher shortage, particularly in rural areas. The teacher shortage is expected to be a long-term issue. In addition, small and rural school districts are having a difficult time competing with pay and benefit packages offered by larger urban districts. Onalaska ISD is not immune to this shortage or competitive disadvantage. To help address this issue and achieve our goal of retaining and recruiting the highest quality teachers and staff for our students, Onalaska ISD is exploring the possibility of adopting a 4-day instructional week starting with the 2023-2024 school year.

As we strive for continuous improvement, we must ask the following questions:


- How can we retain and recruit the very best teachers and staff?

Why a 4-Day Instructional Week?

- Help retain and attract high quality teachers and staff.
- Instructional and support staff will have more time to plan and develop instruction to drive successful student learning.
- Increase student and staff attendance rates.
- Help foster a more positive school culture.

If structured properly, a 4-day instructional week can help support each of these areas.

Onalaska Junior Senior High Changes:

- Class length would increase from 45 minutes to 53 minutes
 - Increase will meet the requirements for CTE program classes
- Homeroom would be removed or modified

Onalaska Elementary Changes:

 30 minutes would be added to the day and integrated into the master schedule

Is the 4-day week being considered for financial reasons?

 No. The 4-day instructional week is not being proposed as a way to save money. This is considered to be revenue neutral.



Would we lose instructional time?

- Instructional time would exceed the state required number of minutes for instruction (75,600).
- While the number of days of instruction would decrease, the length of the school day would be extended to achieve the necessary instructional time. (additional 30 minutes per day)



Would this lower the pay of teachers or other staff members?

 No. This change in calendar would not lower the pay of any OISD employee. We want this change to help retain and recruit staff. This best way to accomplish this is to reduce days worked, and not reduce pay.



What about low income students that rely on the school district for two meals a day?

- Onalaska Elementary and Onalaska Junior Senior High currently work to provide a number of low-income students a weekend meal bag. We will continue these efforts to provide those in need.
- We are working on developing a "Grab and Go" option for our students who are in need of Friday meals.



How would this affect extracurricular activities on Fridays?

- We would play games and participate in other competitions that are on Fridays just as we always have.
 If transportation is an issue on these days, we will develop
- If transportation is an issue on these days, we will develop plans with each program (Athletics, Band, Cheer, Ag., JROTC, etc.) to get students to these activities.



What about the need for childcare?

- OISD would not be able to provide childcare on Fridays.
- However, OISD would be willing to explore creative ways to work with child care providers and churches to help offer child care/programs on Fridays.



How would we know if the 4-Day Instructional Week Pilot Program is successful?

- Employee retention rates increase
- Student academic success
- Size of applicant pool for each posted job opening
- Student attendance rates increase
- Employee attendance rates increase
