The bond amount \$42,000,000 and is expected to be completed for the Fall 2026/2027 School Year.



Bond proceeds will go to building a High School. OISD does not currently have a dedicated High School Facility.



Enrollment at the District has increased each year by roughly 3% over a decade. This growth rate is expected to continue.



Construction of this facility addresses the issues that are challenging each campus in the District, allowing for future growth.



Student Enrollment and Staffing History




CURRENT CAMPUS CHALLENGES DUE TO SPACE:

ONALASKA ELEMENTARY

- 720 Students (PreK-6th Grade)
- All classrooms occupied
- Congested traffic for car rider drop-off/pickup
- Limited extracurricular for 5th and 6th grade
- Eight grade levels creating a large age span (3 years-13 years)
- Lunches from 10:30a.m.-1:20p.m. due to number of grades

ONALASKA JUNIOR SENIOR HIGH

- 540 Students (7th-12th Grade)
- One classroom left for future staffing needs
- Career Technology Education classrooms are not designed for that purpose
- Conflicts created by shared facilities
- Large span between ages (12 years—19 years)
- Small parking and gymnasium eliminates the ability to host graduation and various other High School level events.



Based on 3% Growth Pattern


WHY:

Building Onalaska High School:

- Creates availability for future growth at all 3 campuses
- Allows district to realign grade levels
- Provides purpose designed facilities for CTE programs
- Allows extra-curricular programs for 5th & 6th graders
- Reduces traffic congestion at Onalaska Elementary
- Improves scheduling and lunch times at Onalaska Elementary
- Physical education and athletic facilities on each campus
- Provides opportunity for local graduation, hosting competitions, and provides facilities for community use and events

Homeowners age 65 and older, who have filed Homestead Exemption will NOT see an increase in taxes associated with this Bond.

Onalaska ISD already owns the property for the proposed project. The new High School facilities will cost \$42,000,000 and will be located adjacent to the currently existing Junior/Senior Campus.
